

# ENDING HUMAN TRAFFICKING: THEORY OF CHANGE

## OUR APPROACH

### Working with the Vietnamese government and other partners to:

- Rescue victims from enslavement.
- Provide psycho-social assistance for survivors to recover.
- Train government social workers in trauma-informed care.
- Improve law enforcement and justice systems in victim protection.
- Establish community based prevention systems.
- Increase opportunities for better life through formal channels.
- Strengthen government and non-government cooperation.
- Strengthen the legal framework.

## OUR OUTCOMES (3-5 YEARS)

### Makes it possible to:

- Reduce trafficking and re-trafficking.
- Reduce risky migration.
- Reduce poverty and trafficking perpetration.
- Ensure vulnerable children continue education.
- Improve ability of responsible agencies to combat trafficking.
- Build and share knowledge about 'what works' in combatting human trafficking.

## OUR SYSTEMS CHANGE OUTCOMES (5-10 YEARS)

### Which contributes to:

- Adoption by government and NGOs of evidence-informed approaches to anti-trafficking.
- Sustainable systems of prevention and reducing vulnerability at local level.
- Survivors and vulnerable communities having more say in anti-trafficking strategies.
- A legal framework that protects victims and offers effective forms of justice beyond prosecution only.
